2.	Let's focus on the primary genre/category you write in. What appeals to you most about this genre/category?
3.	List 3 things you'd like your books to be known for.
4.	Now, let's consider the characters in your stories. Choose one of your favorites and tell why you enjoyed writing this character.

5.	How do you want readers to FEEL when they read your stories? (You're a writerbring this answer to life. Use imagery. Employ your senses. Make me FEEL it!)
6.	How do you want your stories to change or challenge your readers?
7.	Think about the feedback you have received from your books. List a few of the MOST COMMON things people say about your work.
8.	Again, think about the feedback you have received from your books. This question is a little different than the last one: What is the one MOST MEANINGFUL thing anyone has said about your work?

9.	PAUSE AND REFLECT: Your answer to #7 tells you something about how people are perceiving you (or your BRAND). Is this hitting the mark for you? Does this match up with what you want to be known for or recognized as? Explain below.
10.	KEEP THE PAUSE BUTTON ON: Your answer to #8 reveals something about your personal
	VALUES. "Meaningful" feedback touches on the things you most care about. For instance, people may commonly say that your books keep them guessing until the last page. THEY value your skill in weaving an intricate plot. While you appreciate these comments, your most meaningful feedback might be from a teenager who said your writing inspired her to enter a short story in a contest.
